

## **Technical Report Guidelines for Student Technology Innovation Competition at ICPVT-14**

Statement should not exceed 6 printed pages or 4 Mb in sizes.

Please refer to ICPVT-14 Paper Format and Paper Layout when preparing **Title, Authors, Abstract, Keywords** and other parts in this technical report.

### **Introduction**

State the objectives of the work and provide an adequate background, avoiding a detailed literature survey or a summary of the results.

### **Problem/Motivation**

Clearly state the problem being addressed and explain the reasons for seeking a solution to this problem.

### **Background**

Describe the specialized (but pertinent) background necessary to appreciate the work. Include references to the literature where appropriate, and briefly explain where your work departs from that done by others.

### **Specification**

Describe your approach in attacking the problem and clearly state how your approach is novel.

### **Results/Contribution**

Clearly show how the results of your work contribute to PVT and explain the significance of those results.

### **Conclusions**

The main conclusions of the innovation may be presented in a short Conclusions section.

### **Acknowledgements**

Collate acknowledgements in a separate section at the end of the article before the references and, therefore, do not include them on the title page, as a footnote to the title or otherwise. List here those individuals who provided help during the research (e.g., providing language help, writing assistance or proof reading the article, etc.).

### **Footnotes**

Footnotes should be used sparingly. Number them consecutively throughout the article, using superscript Arabic numbers. Do not include footnotes in the Reference list.

### **Table footnotes**

Indicate each footnote in a table with a superscript lowercase letter.

### **References**

Please ensure that every reference cited in the text is also present in the reference list (and vice versa). Unpublished results and personal communications are not recommended in the reference list, but may be mentioned in the text. Citation of a reference as 'in press' implies that the item has been accepted for publication.
